

42. Further Description of Important Features Built in 1870, this home is an example of High Victorian Italianate architecture. It is a two-story rectangular brick building with a hipped roof topped by a deck and railing. A single story half-hexagonal bay projects from the left side of the main facade. It is pierced by three tall, narrow, and round-arched windows with hoodmolds. The entryway and asymmetrical fenestration on the main facade are trabeated and the door also includes a fanlight. 43. History and Significance Henry P. Deuscher was a German immigrant who settled in Butler County in 1834. His career was a mixture of farming, mercantile business, and industrial development. He first became a butcher in Trenton, moved to a farm in Madison Township, and then returned to Trenton as a storekeeper under the firm names Deuscher & Wannewetsch and later Deuscher & Borgor. He again returned to his farm and bought a distillery. In 1874 he formed H.P. Deuscher & Co. in Hamilton and went into the malting business. The firm later changed to the		27.
