<p>42. Further Description of Important Features Most distinguishing feature is horizontal white wooden siding made to look like rusticated stone. Greek Revival aspects include full width porch on facade with fluted Doric columns and wide entablature board at cornice. Additions include hood supported by large brackets over side door and 1 1/2 story wing at rear. Built ca. 1852 by Henry Maltby.</p>																	
<p>43. History and Significance Henry Maltby was the pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Oxford from 1848 to 1856. Born in New York in 1806, he studied at Hanover College, N.Y., then taught school and studied for the ministry simultaneously. Preached in Louisville and Cincinnati before moving to Oxford. Helped found the Oxford Female Institute.</p>
