42. Further Description of Important Interior and Exterior Features (Continued on Reverse if Necessary)
2925 Harkie Street is a two-unit ranch house, generally similar in appearance to BUT-2458-8 and BUT-2459-8. The fenestration pattern is WWDDWW. A concrete stoop is located at the front doors. The doors are original. The windows are horizontal sliding windows and appear to be vinyl replacements.

43. History and Significance (Continue on Reverse if necessary)
This house is part of a small pocket of residential development that was constructed between the mid-1950s and mid-1960s. Most of the houses had been constructed before the announcement of plans to expand the Armco steel mill into the land to the west of the houses. Rockford Map Publishers' 1958 county atlas labels the area of Harkie Street as the Sunny Acres Subdivision.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings (See #52)
Harkie Street is a residential cul-de-sac lined with ranch houses and a few ranch-type duplexes. Oxford State Road in this area is a busy four lane divided road. The surrounding area is largely commercial and industrial in character. Other than Harkie Street and two houses at its intersection with Oxford State Road, there are no other residences in the area.

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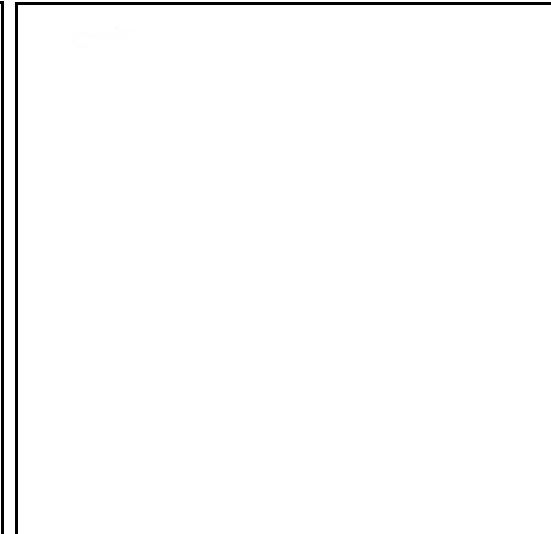
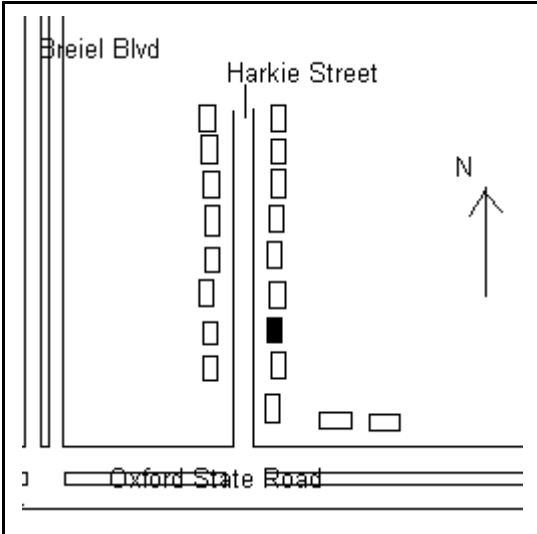
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8. Site Plan with North Arrow
