CELEBRATION SOUVENIRS

Long to be remembered and longer still to be treasured as mementos of the one hundred fiftieth anniversary of the founding of Hamilton, will be its clever and practical souvenirs. First of these were the wooden nickels, good for five cents in trade and destined in hundreds of cases to be retained as relics of the celebration. Second to appear were attractive, black and white pins, cut and painted to depict an ox cart, the prized possessions of many participating in the sesqui-centennial affair. Last of the souvenirs to be offered to celebration throngs were ten-gallon hats that sold like wildfire and appeared atop the heads of young and old in Hamilton.

MUSEUM EXHIBITS

Relics of the days in which Butler County struggled against savages, wilderness, hunger and privation to become the thriving industrial spot it is in 1941 will attract the interest of many who attend activities in the celebration's center in the Butler County fairgrounds. Located by school children among the possessions of their relatives and friends, the relics and historical articles were collected and arranged for display by the Butler County Historical Society.

THE CORONATION BALL

The Coronation Ball, principal social feature of the sesqui-centennial celebration will be held Saturday night, October 4, in the gaily decorated ballroom of the Hotel Manchester in Middletown. Raymond Scott and his orchestra, nationally-known dance aggregation, will present the music. Outstanding event of the evening will be the Coronation scene in which "Our American Girl," "Miss Hamilton," "Miss Middletown," "Miss Oxford" and "Miss Miami" will be crowned amid elaborate ceremonies. Each queen will have 12 attendants, the entire court being attractively gowned to present a colorful picture amid the lavish setting of the sesqui-centennial court.

"MUSKETS ON MIAMI"

The history of Butler County, replete with stirring events of the past that marked the path of progress, will be unfolded nightly during the sesqui-centennial celebration by the gigantic pageant-spectacle "Muskets On Miami." Presented by a cast of nearly 2,000 persons from all sections of the county on a 400-foot stage in the Butler County fairgrounds, the pageant-spectacle will be of absorbing interest to all who witness its scenes. Real trains that chug across the stage, real horses and live-stock, depredations of marauding Indians, will bring to life once more the dangers and triumphs of the men, women and children who lived, fought and died to carve out a peaceful home for those to come.

"THE GARDEN UNDER THE STARS"

Music by the nation's top-ranking orchestras will thrill thousands in "The Garden Under The Stars," central dance spot of the sesqui-centennial celebration in the fairgrounds. Bands of Raymond Scott, Tommy Dorsey, Henry King, Leighton Noble and Frankie Masters will furnish the best in music for dancers on the roofed floor of the location and for those listening from chairs about tables in the surrounding garden areas.

"AVIATION DAY"

A day of events dedicated to the betterment of aviation facilities in Butler County. Aerial performances, contests in the sky and an outstanding display of planes will add to the program attending official dedication of Hamilton airport. Also included as special attractions of the day are the football classic between two bitter rivals, Hamilton High School and Toledo's DiVilbiss High School, an \$800,000 exhibit in the fairgrounds of equipment of the United States Army Air Corps and an air visit to Hamilton by the "Ninety-Nines," only international association of licensed women pilots.

"TRANSPORTATION EXHIBIT"

From the Indian sled to the modern behemoth of the rails, the progress of transportation will be clearly shown in an outstanding array of old and new travel equipment of all sorts. In connection, window displays and dioramas will be arranged to further the theme of progress, central in all sections of the celebration. The transportation exhibits will be in the fairgrounds and on railroad sidings on Erie Highway at Heaton Street and along Sycamore Street, between Second and Fourth Streets.

"MERCHANTS AND MANUFACTURERS EXPOSITION"

The contrast in times of 1791 and today clearly will be seen in displays of old and modern appliances of the home, store and factory to be arranged in a giant, canvas auditorium in the Butler County fairgrounds, the "Merchants and Manufacturers Exposition." Centrally located exhibits, with specially designed back-drops, will bring the theme of progress more vividly to those in attendance. Free acts of entertainment will be presented at regular intervals each day.
