



New Fairfield Township Lane Library Now Under Construction

Construction has begun on the newest Lane Libraries branch, which will be located at 2950 Hamilton Mason Road in Fairfield Township. A ceremonial groundbreaking was held on Wednesday, July 9 with Lane board members, staff, Fairfield Township officials and staff, architects, construction partners, and patrons in attendance. With this expansion, we will offer roughly 40,000 items from these new shelves and create a new access point for the full collection we house across the system. In addition to traditional library services, the new branch will boast a plethora of meeting and gathering spaces, both formal and casual settings. We will host full scale programming for all ages, and outdoor space for programs and individual usage alike. The new Lane facility will also include a full-service drive-thru. Watch for updates over the coming months with an expected opening in late summer of 2026.






























Preserve Your Memories at the Lane Tech Center

The Lane Tech Center's new Memory Lab is where your family's precious memories come to life. This digital conversion station helps you to preserve legacy media like home videos, mix tapes, records, photo negatives and more by converting them to a digital format. This is a free DIY service available by appointment and you can request one-on-one help if desired. Remember to bring your own storage, such as SD cards or flash drives. Digital conversion is a hands-on activity that requires you to stay on site until your project is finished. Plan for roughly double the run time for your project; a 1-hour video, for instance, might take two hours (recording, converting, and allowing for any learning curve or issues).

Tech Center Manager Amanda Bull Chafin has experienced the joy of preserving memories firsthand. "My aunt gave me an old 8mm reel after my uncle passed away. Despite its fragile condition, I managed to convert those childhood moments — from birthday parties to playtime — allowing my aunt to share them with her mother-in-law, sons, and other relatives. The Memory Lab truly helped a grieving family bond and secure these memories for generations to come."


The community read of *Lab Girl* is planned for the winter along with art, writing, poetry and more continuing through the spring, so stay tuned!


