

**CONSTRUCTION UPDATE** 

The Fairfield Township Lane Library construction project is underway! Since the summer groundbreaking, the majority of the groundwork has been completed. Over the course of the winter, you will see the building begin to rise. The structure will start to take shape in early December followed by roofing, exterior paneling, and interior mechanical and electrical work.
