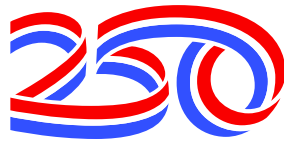

New Nature-Themed Mural at the Oxford Lane Library

The Oxford Lane Library is home to a new mural! This commission, done by Bright Wall Collective, is part of the Big Read initiative happening in the library through the spring. The mural follows the Big Read theme “OUR NATURE: How our Physical Environment Can Lead us to Seek Hope, Courage, and Connection.”

About the Mural: “How to Grow a Dream”

This mural tells a story of connection—between people, nature, and imagination. What begins as a single seed blossoms into ideas and dreams, reflecting how curiosity and creativity can flourish when nurtured. It speaks to how the smallest

beginnings can grow into hope, courage, and positive change. “How to Grow a Dream” invites viewers to explore, discover, and imagine—reminding us that, like stories within a library, our dreams can take root and flourish when we give them space to grow. It encourages library visitors to seek adventure, inspiration and lifelong learning within and beyond the library walls.

Growing guides are produced through research done at the Lane Seed Library. Some plants listed in the growing guides may be out of stock.

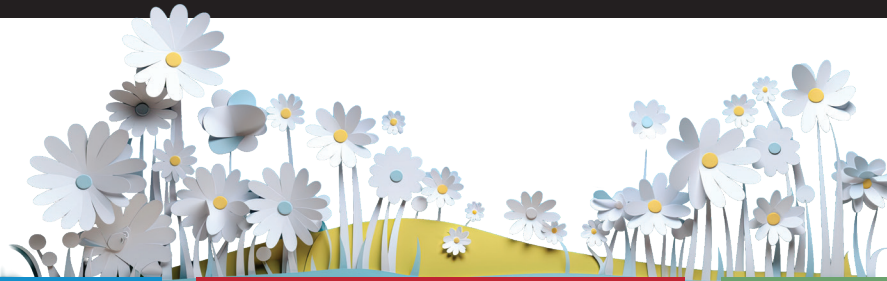
